Church Garden and Grounds

Following on from the Lenten /Easter Garden project, the peace garden acquired a "tree". This was decorated in the colours of Ukraine, and members and friends of Orchardhill, and the local community, were invited to write a message of support on a label to tie on the tree. There are still labels available for those who have not yet participated.

Sunflowers were grown for the peace garden, a display around the Memorial Hall, and for the front of the church, where Giffnock residents tell me that they lift their heart as they turn into Church Road. We were able to give a sunflower seedling to all the children in Giffnock nursery and held a 'pop up' event on Saturday 28th May, when donations were accepted for sunflower seedlings, and coffee was enjoyed. The sum of £259.71 was raised for Ukraine.

Thanks are due to all who saved yoghurt cartons, the large group who sowed and maintained the sunflowers, and others who helped in a variety of ways. Particular thanks go to Giffnock Community Hub at Orchardhill for all their sterling work, including refurbishment of the church benches, and, to our excellent coffee makers.

The sunflower display is coming to an end now, but work continues in the church grounds. Shrubs are being cut back to allow better visibility when exiting from the lower car park. Similarly, the laurel beside the steps between the two car parks will be reduced in height, allowing the floodlight placed on the Memorial hall to illuminate the upper car park sufficiently. Seeded Sycamores will be removed, and the trees on Church Road and Rosslea Drive will receive attention after leaf fall. The hedge bordering Church Road and Claremount Avenue will be cut back in the dormant season between autumn and early spring. Thereafter, it will be trimmed lightly and informally, in order that flower and berry formation is not compromised.

So far, grant applications for water butts have been unsuccessful. It is hoped that we can find some way of securing large water butts to store winter rainfall. This would make watering the peace garden area much easier and would help us move toward the Church of Scotland's target of becoming carbon neutral by 2030.

The next general garden work party will be held on Saturday 1 October. If you are able to help, please give your name to Carol – Anne.



Walk and Talk

Walking for whatever reason, is more enjoyable with someone else. Walking and talking is a great way to communicate with family, friends, and also with God.

The point is that we are doing two things at the same time. We are not just taking exercise or travelling. As we walk together, we are in communion with one another. Both Enoch and Noah 'walked with God' (Genesis 5:24; 6:9). They didn't just sit, kneel or stand with God (the kind of actions we would often associate with spending time with God), but they were also in *communion* with God when doing something else. While you are doing other things – working, eating, exercising or relaxing – you can be in communion with God at the same time.

Personally, I also find it the best way to pray. This has been my pattern for the last few years. After reading the Bible each day, I go out and walk around our local park – which is almost deserted early in the morning. I note down anything I sense the Holy Spirit saying as I pray. You can pray as you walk to the bus stop or walk from one activity to the next. Talk as you walk.

The Bible has a great deal to say about walking with God. It is how you were intended to live. God's desire for you is that you *walk humbly* in a relationship with him (Micah 6:8). This is what Jesus has made possible – for you to *walk as Jesus did* (1 John 2:6). You may stumble from time to time, but one day you will *walk with him* 'dressed in white' (Revelation 3:4)

The Black Door Shop

As the community starts to venture out more we are seeing footfall on a Saturday morning increase, with a few people coming in to look at the items on our shelves. From speaking to them we know they come from Thornliebank, Giffnock and Newton Mearns.

We have been fortunate to have had the assistance of four young people and their parents, who have helped clean the items on the shelves and prepare them for their next life journey. The young people earn Saltire Hours when they are with us. This is a Volunteer Program run via the Scottish Government and Local Authority, and Stephen Bennett is an authorised issuer of certificates, which are available at various hours.

Open Invitation

You will be very welcome to pop in on a Saturday morning to see for yourself how busy it is, with cars arriving from 10am filled with donations. It is remarkable and humbling for us to be part of this venture helping those in need. Once you see for yourself, you may be inclined to pop in and become involved in receiving the items.

Donations

We continue to be well supported by the communities around us, with donations each week which take two or three van trips to convey them to Maslows Refugee Centre in Govan. It is now not possible to keep the donations in the shop area, so we have had to make use of the space under the hall for temporary storage. The van comes on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday each week.

On Saturday we start with a floor mat 4mtrs square empty, and by 3pm it looks like the image below.



Litter

A party of litter collectors leave the workshop every Saturday around 8am, and lift from 4 - 6 bags of litter for the streets around the church covering Fenwick Road, The Library Car Park, the Bill Board at Lidl and return. The Local Authority collects the filled bags at the start of the week. You are welcome to join us on this venture or to go out at other times.
